



## EXAMPLE

Inning 1 – P1 shoots a standard safety break. P2 plays safety.

Inning 2 – P1 runs 20 consecutive balls and then plays safety. P2 misses.

Inning 3 – P1 plays safety. P2 runs 16 balls then misses.

Inning 4 – P1 runs 60 then fouls on next shot. P2 runs 24 then plays safety.

Inning 5 – P1 plays intentional foul. P2 plays intentional foul.

Inning 6 – P1 fouls (3rd consecutive). The balls are re-racked and P1 then plays opening brake shot according to the rules (notice that P1's score is subtracted by 1 for the foul and also 15 for the serious foul). P2 misses.

Inning 7 – P1 runs 38 and out for the win (required score 100).

NOTE 1: High run is indicated by highest number recorded for all innings (P1 = 59, P2 = 24). NOTE 2: More than one score sheet may be used for a match that involves many innings.
